BOD Messages. . .

To the Residents of Lake of the Woods of Jacaranda, Park Estates, The Lakes of Jacaranda and Grassy Oaks I, II & III

Garbage, Recycling & Yard Waste – Covenants vs. County. . .

The Board has received complaints that many homeowners have begun to put out their trash, recyclables and yard waste for collection during the morning and early afternoon on Thursday. Sarasota County Ordinances take precedence over the LOWofJ Covenants. Our Covenants Section (7.21.05) states that you can put out your trash no more than twenty-four (24) hours in advance of collection. However, County Ordinance 2006-001 takes precedence:

Sarasota County Ordinance 2006-001: Garbage, recycling and yard waste can **only** be placed **out after 5 PM the day before pickup**. The items must be at the curb at 6 AM the morning of pickup. All items should be at the curb, not in the street. Any cans or bins must be removed by 10 AM the day after.

We all want to preserve the aesthetic quality of our community. Our management company will spot-check to ensure compliance. I thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Citrus Trees in Florida. . .

James J. Ferguson, Florida State Department of Agriculture and expert on pruning had the following message for Florida residents.

Although large machines prune closely-planted trees in commercial citrus groves on a regular basis, dooryard citrus need not be pruned at all. There are exceptions: aesthetic purposes, to prevent shading of other plants, to prevent soil-borne diseases, to remove old-damaged limbs, to rejuvenate old trees with reduced vigor, twig and small branch dieback, and small fruit.

LAKES AND WETLANDS COMMITTEE REPORT - August 2011

Once again the Lakes and Wetland Committee would like to emphasize that the areas in our neighborhood deemed conservation areas (mesic hammocks) require special consideration. Sarasota Environmental Resource Protection has the responsibility to oversee them and the authority to levy fines on the Home Owners Association in the case of violations such as dumping foreign materials or removing native plants growing in the area. On July 26th, several BOD and committee members spot checked the mesic hammocks and found intrusion violations that require corrective action, which have been initiated.

Additional signs have been placed on the perimeters of the mesic hammocks, warning residents that any activity within the mesic hammocks must be approved by Sarasota Environmental Resource Protection.

With the advent of heavy rains it is important to keep our street drains clear and unobstructed on a regular basis to ensure that rainwater will have a clear path to flow off the streets and into the lakes. On a recent neighborhood drive through the Lakes and Wetlands Committee found a couple of street drains that had tree branches and other debris in them. Please remember that any foreign objects in the drains from the street or in the lakes can be a

potential problem as the rainy season continues. This is important to our neighborhood because obstructions that block the flow of water from the street into the lakes could cause a back up of water onto the street and driveways. Everything that goes into the street drains eventually ends up in the lakes including chemicals and yard waste.

BOD Messages. . .

LOJ Clubhouse Doors -

On August 4th and 5th we closed the clubhouse so new doors, upgraded to hurricane safety standards, could be installed. Well, the doors didn't get installed as quickly as expected but after a few hiccups they are in. The new doors are wind resistant to 150 mph and incorporate a safety bar release system to allow people to exit more readily in emergencies. The doors also do not have window grids, each window is one solid pane. The locks for these two door sets and the interior bathroom doors have all been changed to a new key set.

Security Issues –

The ADT lock system has not been working as advertised since it was first installed. Re-visits by ADT disclosed that the wiring was improperly installed and an interior lock was inappropriately installed in an exterior application. Corrections are complete and future use of the magnetic lock system should be trouble-free. Please report any future malfunctions to Keys-Caldwell.

Clubhouse Storage –

Beverly Weltzien and I are working on a plan to improve storage in the clubhouse. We are collecting preliminary bids, and will present our recommendations to the Board of Directors at the October 4th Board meeting.
